

Privacy Notice for Department for Education (DFE) Funded Training Programmes

Information held about you

As part of the funded training programme that you have enrolled on, Hoople will collect personal data about you and members of your household where appropriate.

This information will include: -

- Personal details such as address, telephone number, e-mail address, date of birth, household situation, prior attainment, educational and employment history, additional learning needs, and medical/health status.
- Financial details such as household income, and bank account details to apply for 16-19 bursaries.
- Learning contact we have had with you including details of meetings, observations, reviews, examination results and assessment decisions.

Who is processing my data?

All personal data held, is processed in accordance with data protection law. The Data Controller for the information outlined in this privacy notice is Hoople Limited.

How will we use the Information we hold about you?

We will collect information about you (where applicable) to:-

- Process your application,
- Manage and support you through the lifecycle of the training programme
- Comply with DFE (Department for Education) funding regulations

What is the legal basis for us to process your data?

The legal basis for processing the data is carrying out of a contract in relation to your training programme to which you are a party.

Who will we share your information with?

In order to comply with contractual obligations, we may share your information with partner organisations including: -

- Department for Education (DFE)
- Learner Records Service
- OFSTED
- Awarding bodies

On occasions, your information may be accessed by contracted IT support organisations in the delivery of IT support for both the IT infrastructure and associated systems, for the processes detailed in this privacy notice. Access by IT support will only be for such reasons as fixing any technical issues with software, and any viewing of data will be incidental to this.

Subject to strict agreements describing how it will be used, your information may also be shared with:

- The local authority – for Learners aged 16-19, or those learners with a Statement of Education, Health and Care Plan (EHC Plan), under the raising the participation age (RPA) agenda.
- The local authority- for the purposes of safeguarding, social services and/or additional learning support.
- Police- for the purposes of safeguarding.
- Health Services- for the purposes of safeguarding.
- Work placement providers.

We will not normally share your information with organisations other than our partner organisations without your consent, however, there may be certain circumstances where we would share without consent such as where we are required to do so by law, to safeguard public safety, and in risk of harm or emergency situations. Any information which is shared will only be shared on a need to know basis, with appropriate individuals. Only the minimum information for the purpose will be shared.

How long do we keep your records?

We will only keep your information for the minimum period necessary. The information outlined in this privacy notice will be kept in line with the DFE (Department for Education) & ESF (European Social Fund Programme Contract (For the 2014-20 ESF programme until at least 31st December 2030.)) All information will be held securely and destroyed under confidential conditions.

Your rights

You have a number of rights under data protection law, including the right to request your information and to request that the information be amended or erased if incorrect.
